



Equine Dentistry at Wensum Valley Vets

<u>DID YOU KNOW...</u> we have purchased two new battery-powered motorised dental systems in the last 18 months. By investing in this, and a full range of dental equipment, we are able to offer you a professional and comprehensive equine dental service. We can carry out both routine and advanced dental procedures on your horse. We also continuously invest time and money into professional development to ensure our vets are up-to-date with new procedures and techniques.

During our routine dental work, we ensure that your horse's mouth is as comfortable as possible, whatever their age or role in life. We sometimes find problems which require more advanced work to be carried out.



These include, but are not limited to:

- Loose Teeth
- Fractured Teeth
- Infundibular Caries (equivalent to a cavity)
- Diastema (gaps between the teeth, often containing rotting food)

Many of these issues can be incredibly painful for your horse and they may need advanced dentistry in order to treat the problem. Some will be covered by insurance for vets fees.

Horses with dental issues may show a variety of clinical signs such as:

- Ridden performance issues and / or temperament change
- Quidding (dropping food)
- Weight loss
- Reluctance to eat

As well as our powerfloats, we have invested in a state-ofthe-art wireless radiography unit, to ensure we get high resolution radiographs of your horses head when needed.

Most advanced procedures we perform at our clinic under 'standing sedation' and local anaesthetic blocks, but when needed, we are able to get a visiting dental specialist to carry out some techniques - such as filling infundibular caries.



Equine Metabolic Syndrome and Cushing's Disease

Last month, our newsletter highlighted the diseases that significantly contribute to the risk of your horse developing laminitis. Between them, these conditions play a part in over 90% of laminitis cases seen.



We are still seeing new cases of laminitis develop, and going into winter provides the perfect opportunity to get on top of your horse's weight management. With less grass on the pasture we can control the amount of hay our horses are receiving, to ensure that next spring and summer we are not fighting a losing battle.

To recap, Equine Metabolic Syndrome and Cushing's disease can both be tested for by taking some blood. This allows us to make an informed plan on how to manage your horse's weight and reduce the risk of your horse developing laminitis.
